Family of believers at St. Paul Lutheran—

We had these verses in our gospel lectionary reading a few weeks ago. At that time I made the comment how they were also the basis for the first sermon I gave in our sanctuary 3 years ago, showing how we have now gone through a complete lectionary cycle together. Some things have changed since then—we've seen some of our members move on to the Church Triumphant, and we've made some adjustments with new music, movie nights and re-starting the live nativity and Addison parade events. Other things remain the same, most especially the historic faith we believe and confess in our creeds about Jesus Christ week in and week out.

The topic of that first sermon 3 years ago was about worrying—how all of us have them and it seems to be something we never outgrow. That is still true today just as it was 3 years ago. As I write, I am in the midst of an extra busy week, with one funeral service behind me, one yet to come, and the regular weekend service ahead. Bible studies will begin again soon, as well as confirmation. Circuit meetings resume again in the fall as well. Kids' activities have begun, leaving no shortage of opportunities for worry in my own head.

In your own lives there are more examples of the same, no doubt. Not to mention all the chaos that seems to bombard our lives on a daily basis, most especially the recent school shooting in Minnesota *in a church*, *during Mass*, of all places. It can seem like a no brainer that we *should* worry. We care about other people and want to do what we can to keep our loved ones safe.

But worry is really an assumption that God doesn't have things under control, that He might be asleep at the wheel. When you look at it from that perspective, it can be easier to understand why Jesus tells us we should never worry. He doesn't sleep at the wheel, He knows what's going on in the world and in our lives. He knows how to steer this world towards the last day, the culmination of all human history. Some are saying we should move on from 'thoughts and prayers' anytime a situation arises that causes us to worry. The idea is that they haven't worked at stopping all the chaos so far, so we shouldn't expect that to change. But Jesus tells us just the opposite. We are worth more than birds, and our life is more than anything that causes us to worry. A colleague recently commented how, in those times of worry, when heathen people tell you not to pray, you should pray even more. And why? Because we believe in a God who is listening. You don't have to be happy, but nonetheless, don't worry. Instead, pray to our God at anytime, anyplace. He takes our worries and replaces it with peace, enabling us to say, despite all the chaos in our world, *it is well, it is well with my soul*.

Quilt Weekend will be held this year on September 27 & 28. The quilts that have been pieced together during the year will decorate the church that weekend before they are packed up and shipped off to bring comfort and warmth to people in need. The large quilts will be distributed nationally and internationally by Lutheran World Relief and the small quilts will be donated to a local Ronald McDonald House.

In order to raise funds to make more quilts, we will have a door offering after both services that weekend. Also, large quilts (60"x 80") can be purchased for \$50 and child-sized quilts (42" or 45" x 54") will be available for \$35.

We have been bountifully blessed by the support of our church family and by overwhelming donations of fabric from "outside" friends. Many thanks to all of you for helping to share our love of Christ through the practical gift of quilts!

We meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of most months to tie knots in quilts. Anyone who is available from 10:15-11:45 a.m. and can tie a knot is encouraged to join us. If you can cut 9" squares of fabric, you could do that on your own schedule (tools can be provided). If you can sew a straight 9" seam, we have an extra sewing machine you can use (or learn to use) and you can also do that on your own time.
