We are shifting from thinking of God's plan to bring Jesus to Earth in order to pay for our sins to thinking of the current arrangement of Jesus 'working from home,' enabling His Church to continue to grow and deliver His message until the end of time. We are part of that master plan He has in motion, so let us continue to meet, not neglecting to do so as is the habit of some, as the author of Hebrews also states. The summer months are when it is easy to put the habit of coming to church and hearing God's message by the wayside. But Jesus still intercedes for us during this time and wants to deliver His message to us, so let's keep the habit alive in our hearts. We all need it and the others in our family of believers need it too!


